What is a Gospel?

- ⇒ gospel | 'gäspəl |
- * ORIGIN Old English gōdspel, from gōd [good] + spel [news, a story], translating from Greek euangelion 'good news';

1 Peter 5:13

The church that is at Babylon, elected together with you, saluteth you; and so doth Marcus my son.

The gospel according to Peter?

Probably written to Roman Christians

Mark 7: 1-4

The Pharisees and some of the teachers of the law who had come from Jerusalem gathered around Jesus and saw some of his disciples eating food with hands that were defiled, that is, unwashed. (The Pharisees and all the Jews do not eat unless they give their hands a ceremonial washing, holding to the tradition of the elders. When they come from the marketplace they do not eat unless they wash. And they observe many other traditions, such as the washing of cups, pitchers and kettles.)

* What would we **NOT** know if it weren't for the writings of Mark?

Pigs are numbered (2000) (5:13)

Jesus was a Carpenter (6:3)

Miracle: Deaf Decapolis man (7:31-37)

Miracle: Blind Bethsaida man (8:22-26)

Young naked man fleeing (14:51-52)

Simon the Cyrene's sons-Rufus & Alexander (15:21)

* The controversial extended ending: 16:9-20

[The earliest manuscripts and some other ancient witnesses do not have Mark 16:9-20]
